Judith A. Shinogle, PhD, is an assistant professor of health economics in the Department of Health Services Administration. Dr. Shinogle received her doctorate in health economics from The Johns Hopkins University and was a National Institute of Mental Health Pre-Doctoral Fellow in Mental Health Economics. She received the 2004 NCHS/AcademyHealth Policy Fellowship to examine how state policies affect the generosity of health and mental health insurance coverage using the National Health Employer Health Insurance Survey. Prior to joining the University of Maryland she was a Senior Economist at RTI, International in their Washington, DC office. Her work at RTI included examining patterns of expenditures and utilization of health services in the Military pediatric populations as well as examining small area variation. Dr. Shinogle was involved in several projects on the Medicare Prescription drug benefit that include developing methods for examining adverse drug events in claims data, examining generosity of the benefit and how states will implement this program for duals with severe mental illness. She was an assistant professor of economics in the Pharmaceutical Outcomes Sciences Department at University of South Carolina's College of Pharmacy and the Arnold School of Public Health. Her research focused on modeling the interaction of employee benefits such as private disability insurance, disability management, prescription drug coverage and mental health benefits using large claims data bases or public data.
